Christ School continues to uphold its tradition of academic brilliance as all 200 students who appeared for the ICSE Board Examination 2024-25 successfully passed, achieving a 100% pass result. The school proudly celebrates 170 distinctions, with 24 students scoring above 95% and 69 above 90%, marking yet another year of scholastic excellence.


